It's been 5 years since Bryn's last CD *Keep The Faith*. Ever the working musician travelling from town to town he has found time to write some great new songs, road test them and then record these brand new tracks.

"ONE WAY TICKET" sees him returning firmly to his rhythm and blues roots, with the occasional light jazz, folk and reggae detour. He is accompanied on his journey by renowned drummer Henry Spinetti (Eric Clapton, Katie Melua), blues maestro Dave Bronze (Eric Clapton, Tom Jones, Eric Bibb) on bass guitar; Mark Edwards (Chris Rea) on keyboards, Karlos Edwards (Take That, Duffy) on percussion, Mal Pope (Aled Jones, Art Garfunkel) providing backing vocals, and some stunning harmonica playing on the title track from the legendry Paul Jones. This is a great, tight, rocking band that will lift your spirit!

9 of the 12 brand new tracks are Bryn's own compositions and there are also 3 arrangements of traditional classics - Sister Rosetta Tharpe's 40's 'Strange Things Happening Every Day', a 'spiritual' from the 20's 'Nobody's Fault but Mine', and even a Christmas carol 'Once in Royal David's City' - like you've never heard it before.

The lyrics are firmly rooted in the Gospel, and as usual on Bryn's albums there is also a fair sprinkling of songs about everyday life and love. Every blues guitar player needs a train song, says Bryn, and finally he has one - the rip-roaring 'One Way Ticket', which charges along with all the exuberance and excitement of a fast train with Paul Jones' hot harmonica and Bryn's electric slide daring you not to get on board.

Most notable is the amount of guitar playing there is on this album. On previous albums Bryn has often given way to other instrumentalists, but here he keeps the centre ground for his guitar which sings out from every track (except when giving way to his own mandolin or harpalek).

The album was recorded at ICC Studios and is co-produced and engineered by Neil Costello, who has helped to create a first class sound. This is an album not to be missed.

Bryn will be touring with the album across the UK throughout the winter/spring in a variety of venues. Half of his concert work these days is now inside prisons, and several of the songs on the album have been inspired by conversations with inmates of these establishments. From these times has grown in Bryn a desire to put together an album of songs to help inmates find the transforming power of Jesus in their lives.

And 7 of the tracks from *One Way Ticket* have formed the foundation for the new compilation 'Inside Out...

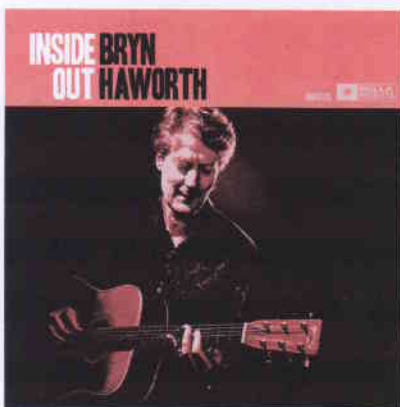
'INSIDE OUT' - BRYN'S 30 YEAR STRETCH

From 1980 when Bryn recorded his first Gospel Album 'The Gap' to 2010 and the release of his 12th Gospel Album 'One Way Ticket' Bryn has written songs incorporating the Christian message in everyday language couched in the finest of rhythm and blues and folk rock music. For 20 of these years Bryn has been taking his music into prisons across the UK; sharing the freedom of the Gospel with all who will hear; often carrying a brief case stuffed with CDs to give to the prison Chaplaincy departments to lend out to inmates so they can listen in their cells; and thinking how good it would be to have one CD which was just for them - an all in one album through which they could find Jesus - the one who loves them and believes in them, and experience his transforming power in their lives. This idea became a reality this year with funding from The Music In Ministry Trust.

The CD is free for prison inmates, but it stands on its own as a fresh new compilation of Bryn's music and is available to buy from www.brynhaworth.com from Sept 1st.
